ROADWORKS OUTSIDE SCHOOL

As you will have seen, roadworks have started this week at the junction with Gammons Lane and Howard Close not far from the school entrance.

There will be a three way set of lights on the roundabout. Cadent are hoping that they won't have to include Elm Grove and become four-way lights.

Once Cadent start excavating the road, the lights will remain in place and in operation 24 hours a day until the works are complete. It has been provisionally booked for 2 weeks, but anticipate finishing much quicker, but the scale of works won't be known until they excavate the existing gas main.
