Dear Parents and Carers,

Tony Fitzpatrick visited our lovely school this week. He is the Director of Education in Hertfordshire. He had a tour of the school and talked to us about the educational provision on offer. He was impressed by how inclusive Beechfield is and commented on the great behaviour for learning and the provision meeting the needs of all children.

I would like to personally thank you all for your collective efforts to improve our attendance. I have been monitoring attendance weekly and I am pleased to say there are very few children who are persistently absent (less than 90%) or severely absent (less than 50%). We really want all children in school every day. We know that this impacts on all areas of learning academic, social and emotional. We are aiming for 97% attendance over the year so please continue to support us with this.

Beechfield has been nominated for Pastoral Primary School of the Year. The awards ceremony is taking place this evening. We are hoping that the school wins, but even if we don't we feel it has been a great recognition to have made the national shortlist. We will let you know the outcome in the next newsletter.


#### JUNIOR PARK RUN

We encourage students to research good recycling practices to make sure they're using the correct information. We're looking for creative, engaging posters that focus on key messages, like rinsing out food cartons or squashing down cardboard boxes before you recycle them.

We'll pick a winner from each key stage, whose posters will be displayed on digital screens around the borough and posted on Watford Council's social media.

An overall winner will be voted for by our operatives who collect your waste and recycling and keep your streets clean every week.

The overall winner's school will also receive a visit from Watford's elected Mayor Peter Taylor in November.




