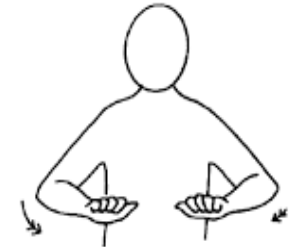
THEME OF THE WEEK

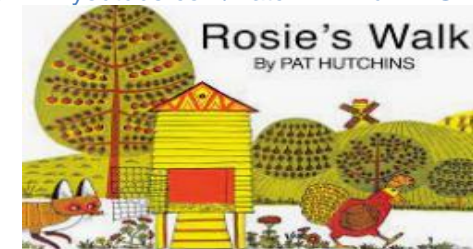

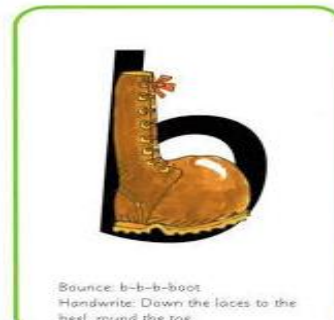
Old MacDonald had a farm
